Minutes of Public Hearings Town of Perry Thursday, August 7, 2014 Perry Town Hall

- Call to order: Chairman Roger Kittleson called the public hearings to order at 7:35PM. Supervisors Ken Hefty and Mick Klein Kennedy, Treasurer Stephanie Zwettler and Clerk Mary Price were present. Also in attendance: Ken Bartz, Doug Nelson, Sonja Luetschwager, Gerhard Luetschwager.
- 2. Recycling Ordinance amendment
  - a. Healthcare Waste

Section 1.20 NON-DISPOSABLE MATERIALS. It shall be unlawful for any person to place for disposal any of the following wastes: hazardous and toxic wastes, chemicals, explosives, flammable liquids, paint, trees and stumps, construction debris, carcasses, medical waste (unless personal needles, which shall be contained in cardboard to eliminate injury to collection personnel).

<u>PROHIBITION ON DISPOSAL OF MEDICAL SHARPS. It shall be unlawful</u> for any person to dispose of sharp medical equipment such as needles, syringes with intact or attached needles, and lancets, whether for human or animal use, in the Town of Perry. It is illegal in the State of Wisconsin to put sharps in the trash or with recyclables. Sharps shall be contained in a rigid puncture-resistant container and taken to a registered collection station.

<u>The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources publishes current</u> information, based on Wisconsin statutes, to manage healthcare waste.

b. Hours of Operation

Section 1.26 PLACEMENT OF RECYCLABLES AND SOLID WASTE <u>AND</u> <u>HOURS OF OPERATION</u>. Except as otherwise specifically directed by the Perry Town Board, solid waste and recyclables shall be dropped off at the Recycling Center located in the village of Daleyville on CTH A on Saturday mornings from 8:00 AM until 12:00 noon, <u>and additional opening hours as approved by the</u> <u>Town Board</u>.

<u>Delivering trash and recyclables to the Recycling Center outside of</u> <u>approved hours will be considered trespassing on Town property and will be</u> <u>subject to citation.</u>

Ken Bartz requested more information about enforcement. Gerhard Luetschwager requested clarification on disposal of deer carcasses. 3. Building Ordinance amendment -

Swimming Pools

<u>"Section 1.04 (3) Swimming Pools. Inground Pool - A private or residential</u> <u>swimming pool is a permanent structure containing a body of water in a</u> <u>receptacle or other container used or intended to be used solely by the owner,</u> <u>operator, or lessee thereof and his family, and by friends invited to use it, and</u> <u>includes all structural facilities, appliances and appurtenances, equipment and</u> <u>other items used and intended to be used for the operation and maintenance of a</u> <u>private or residential swimming pool.</u>

<u>Exempt Pool:</u> Storable above-ground pool, not permanently affixed to the ground, which are so constructed that they may be readily disassembled for storage and reassembled to their original integrity are exempt from the provisions of this section."

4. Public Hearing on a proposed Implements of Husbandry Ordinance.

Ordinance to Totally Opt Out of IOH Length and Weight Limits Whereas, 2013 Wis. Act 377 under Sec. 348.27 (19)(b)5.a. provides that a municipality or county may authorize implements of husbandry as defined in Sec. 340.01 (24) and agricultural commercial vehicles as defined in Sec. 340.01 (10) of Wis. Statutes to exceed any statutory length and weight limits imposed by Chapter 348 of Wis. Statutes,

Now, therefore, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the Town Board of Perry, of Dane County, that pursuant to Sec. 348.27 (19)(b)5.a. of Wis. Statutes, implements of husbandry and agricultural commercial vehicles as defined by Chapter 340 of Wis. Statutes may exceed any length and weight limits imposed by Chapter 348 of Wis. Statutes.

Further, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED that this ordinance shall remain in effect until rescinded by further action of the board.

5. Adjourn. Ken Hefty moved and Mick Klein Kennedy seconded a motion to adjourn the Public Hearings. Motion carried. The public hearings were adjourned at 7:45 PM.
