Volunteer Opportunities in the Hauge Historic District Park

Build wooden Leopold benches from 2X6 pressure treated lumber. The pattern and wood and hardware are supplied. Use your own power and hand tools.

Assemble a wooden picnic table. The wood and hardware are supplied. The table is partially assembled. Use your own tools.

Cut firewood from a brush pile and haul away. The firewood is free for the taking. Use your own chainsaw.

Trim trees. Standing on the ground no ladders. Use your own chainsaw/handsaw.

Trim grass around the base of informational markers, benches and picnic tables. Use your own hand/power trimmer.

Cut and remove old fence wire. Use your own hand tools.

Tighten nuts and bolts holding existing park benches together. Use your own hand tools.

Drive fence posts for park signs. Post driver supplied.

Install Park Boundary signs on existing fence posts at specified locations. Hardware supplied. Use your own hand tools.

Prepare grant applications. Application form supplied. Use your own computer.

Post park reviews on Trip Advisor, Travel Wisconsin and other Tourism web sites. Links to web sites supplied. Use your own computer.

Invite friends, family and groups who might be interested in visiting the park. Park Brochures provided.

Distribute park brochures to museums, shops, visitor centers, hotels, restaurants, etc.. Park Brochures provided.

Walk the park to pick-up trash and debris.
