In 1999, per Wisconsin State Statutes, municipalities were obligated to prepare a comprehensive plan to identify issues and establish goals to guide the Town in any future development and growth over the next twenty (20) years. An initial survey was distributed by the Town to residents in 2004 to assist in identifying issues that should be considered in the Plan. The "Town of Perry Comprehensive Plan" was approved in 2006 and is available on the town's website, www.perry-wi.gov.

Wisconsin State Statutes also require towns to update their comprehensive plan within twenty (20) years of the date it was adopted. LAND USE PLAN

The Town of Perry's Land Use Plan (www.perry-wi.gov) provides criteria for the siting of new homes and permanent structures. The Town's density unit inventory was calculated using the formula of 1 housing unit per 35 acres of contiguous land owned as of August 22, 1979, the date of adoption of the Land Use Plan. Density units are consumed chronologically. Most dwellings are built on parcels of land less than 35 acres. The questions below pertain to the Land Use Plan:
